GARDA VETTING

- If you plan to work with Minors / Children or vulnerable adults you must be Garda Vetted
- Must be 16 to be Garda Vetted you cannot apply until you turn 16
- Parents responsible for vetting if required
- Takes approx. 4-8 weeks to return
- Check with placements if they require Vetting and they should supply vetting forms

UNDER 16

- Some placements will not take students as they are not vetted
- Some will accept students
- Some require a letter from school / have their own forms to be filled

TY PROGRAMMES

- A number of companies run TY Programmes. Any offered through the school will be shared on Teams. Students often find these programmes themselves.
- Students may attend up to <u>2 of these (max)</u> in the school year.
- Parental consent forms & documentation confirming you have a place on the programme is required by the school.
- You must still complete:
 2 weeks Community Care and 2 weeks Work Experience
- Documentation must be provided to the school at latest <u>1 week</u> before going on a programme or you will be marked absent.
- No extra work experience is allowed in school time



GAISCE - THE PRESIDENT'S AWARD the President's

Open to all students in Transition Year in Holy Faith. Participants must be at least age 15 to enter. A minimum of one hour a week is required in the following areas:

- Community Involvement 13 weeks
- Personal Skill 13 weeks
- Physical Recreation 13 weeks

(Additional activity in any section of your choice from the three above for a further 13 weeks)

Venture Journey

Plan prepare and undertake a 2 day, 1 night adventure journey in a group covering a minimum total distance of : Walking;25–35 km

Only students registered, undertaking & completing the Gaisce Bronze Challenge may take part in the Venture Hike

Please note: Scouting Awards will not qualify students for inclusion on the Venture
